Here's how OG&E Wind Power is sold

OG&E wind power is sold in the form of Renewable Energy Credits, also referred to as RECs.

How is OG&E wind power sold?

OG&E wind power is sold in the form of Renewable Energy Credits, also referred to as RECs. Each REC is equal to 1,000 kilowatt hours (kWh) or one megawatt-hour (MWh) of energy. RECs are proof that at least one megawatt-hour of electricity was generated by a renewable energy source.

What is a Renewable Energy Credit (REC)?

A Renewable Energy Credit simply indicates that 1,000 kilowatt hours (or one megawatt-hour) of energy was generated from a renewable energy source such as wind and solar.

How much impact can a REC purchase have on the environment?

Purchasing as little as 100 kWh of wind power per month for one year is similar to planting 0.3 acres of trees and is the equivalent of removing 0.9 tons of emissions from the air. One acre of trees removes three tons of emissions from the air.

Does all of OG&E's RECs come from wind power?

Yes, all of OG&E's RECs are generated from wind power supplied by our Sooner and Centennial Wind Farms in Northwest Oklahoma. As additional wind farms are developed, more wind RECs will become available.

How is the new wind program different from OG&E's first wind offering?

The first program was tied to our first wind farm located near Woodward, Oklahoma. Only those customers who were willing to sign-up for wind power received the benefits and/or the additional cost for wind power. Those customers were willing to pay extra for renewable energy. OG&E's Centennial wind farm has made it possible for all customers to receive the benefits of wind power. Because of an increase in the cost of natural gas, electricity generated by wind power is less expensive than OG&E's average fuel cost. So, every kilowatt hour (kWh) of wind power saves all OG&E customers money, not just those who signed up for wind power.

How can I sign-up for OG&E's wind REC program?

OG&E offers four different levels of wind power RECs.

Subscription Level	Percent of your Annual Usage	REC Price Per kWh
A	25%	\$0.009 per kWh
B	50%	\$0.008 per kWh
C	100%	\$0.007 per kWh
D	Minimum 100 MWh	\$7.00 per MWh

Customers will be billed at their selected level for 12 months. For example, if you use 12,000 kilowatt hour (kWh) per year (1,000 kWh/month) and you select subscription level A, which is 25 percent of your annual household usage, a REC charge of \$2.25 would be added to your monthly bill.

Can I resell my RECs from OG&E?

No, the RECs that you purchase cannot be resold.

How long is a subscription period?

The initial subscription period is one year. After the first year, you may remain on the REC program until you request to stop.

Am I obligated to sign up each year?

No. Customers can choose to get off of the program at any time after the first contract year.

What are the benefits for purchasing wind power RECs?

You will be recognized as someone who supports a clean environment and helping to reduce carbon emissions.
